WATERSMART

The Town of Salem, NH has partnered with WaterSmart Software to provide their customers with the ability to see their daily water consumption data. The WaterSmart portal is a great resource for Salem water customers to better understand their water usage. In addition, it helps with automated alerts that will notify the customer of potential high volume or continuous glow(which may be indicative of a leak), as well as will forecast notifications. WaterSmart is a data driven customer engagement and analytics platform, offering greater insight and control over water use in Salem homes and businesses. BOATING SAFETY ON THE LAKE

We are happy to see so many residence boating on the lake this year!! With an increase in boaters enjoying the lake we have also received some reports of boaters forgetting the laws and causing safety risks to other boaters and damage to some of the docked boats. We just wanted to send out a reminder of important NH Boating safety laws taken from the NH Boating handbook

Unlawful Operation

NH law states that these dangerous operating practices are illegal.

- Failure to follow the navigational rules shown here.
- Unsafe passage is not maintaining a proper speed or distance while operating a vessel. Specifically, the following operations are illegal.
 - Operating a vessel at greater than headway speed(no wake is allowed) within 150 feet of:
 - -people in the water
 - -other vessels
 - -docks or moorings
 - -the shoreline

Headway speed- The lowest speed at which it is still possible to maintain steering or 6 miles per hour.



Meeting Head-On

Power vs. Power: Neither vessel is the stand-on vessel. Both vessels should keep to the starboard (right).

Power vs. Sail: The powerboat is the give-way vessel. The sailboat is the stand-on vessel.

Crossing Situations

Power vs. Power: The vessel on the operator's port (left) side is the give-way vessel. The vessel on the operator's starboard (right) side is the stand-on vessel.

Power vs. Sail: The powerboat is the give-way vessel. The sailboat is the stand-on vessel.

Overtaking

Power vs. Power: The vessel that is overtaking another vessel is the give-way vessel. The vessel being overtaken is the stand-on vessel.

IN THE KNOW

- The CLPA continues to work with the Department of Environmental Services to closely monitor chloride levels in our lake. Volunteers from the CLPA have submitted a water sample to the NHDES lab in June and will continue monthly through September.
- The Southern New Hampshire Water supply is now connected and supplying the town with 400,000 gallons of water per day. During the summer months the average water demand on the Salem municipal system is about 4 million gallons per day, so this represents about 10% of the total. This will reduce some of the pressure that Salem's water usage puts on the lake during the summer months. **ONLINE MEMBERSHIP**
