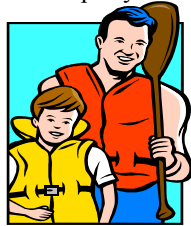

Loon Update

Timothy Demers (Seacoast Field Biologist, Loon Preservation Committee (www.loon.org), Loon Center: (603) 476-5666 Cell: (702) 544-2025) visited Canobie Lake on 6/30/14 to check on our loons. Yes, he observed three loons and made these comments: "This rogue loon (the 3rd loon) might be affecting the pair there if it's been there a lot, but if they did not want that loon there they would drive it off. As to why some loons nested on time this year while others are so late is anyone's guess. I have seen a couple suitable nesting sites on the lake that might work so it's not as though there isn't anywhere for them to go. I doubt it's human disturbance because I've found loon nests on lakes and ponds where the boat traffic can be downright insulting, but all loons are different. If this pair wants to nest though, they better get to it. The window for allowing enough time for the chicks to grow and prepare for winter is rapidly closing."



Boating Safety

We would like to remind all of our boating families to insure that your boat is registered and equipped with required items and that the driver be certified (for motors over 25 hp). Here are a couple other safety tips: When a boat is under way no one is permitted outside the protective railing on a pontoon boat. All boats, including canoes and kayaks, are required to display navigation lights between sunset and sunrise, and in periods of restricted visibility such as fog or heavy rain. Be aware that the official time is sunset and sunrise, not "when it really gets dark". Children under 6 MUST wear a life jacket at all times. It is strongly recommended that children of all ages wear their life jackets.

Pictures of WEEDS Wanted

The NH Department of Environmental Services encourages lake associations to have a volunteer Weed Watchers program. It's important for early detection of invasive weeds, if any, entering Canobie Lake. Our best chance of preventing spread is to catch it early. Please contact Bill Schroeder (wesCLPA@myfairpoint.net) if you would like to be trained to become our "weed watcher". We had an official weed survey done in the fall. Please go to our web site to read the report and see the map of weeds.

If you see weeds that are of concern please take pictures of them and email the pictures to Amy Smagula at amy.smagula@des.nh.gov She will identify them for us!

Swimming is not allowed (by State Law) in Canobie Lake

Please help protect the quality of our water by practicing a no swim policy and encouraging others to abide by the State law.

Jet Skis are prohibited from use on Canobie Lake

Please help the public be aware of this regulation.
